Impact of Personal Care Products on Swimming Pool Water Quality

We would like to remind all families of the importance of maintaining high water quality in our school swimming pool to ensure a safe and healthy environment for all students.

Recently, we have observed that certain personal care products—such as **shower gels, body creams, hair conditioners, and oils**—are affecting the quality of the pool water. These products can react with the pool's disinfectants and create compounds that lead to:

- Strong chlorine smells,
- Eye and skin irritation,
- Cloudy water,
- And increased strain on the pool's filtration and chemical systems.

To help maintain the cleanliness and safety of our swimming facilities, we kindly ask that students **do not use any personal care products before swimming sessions**. We also request that all students **shower with water only before entering the pool**.

Thank you for your continued support in promoting a safe and healthy environment for our swimmers.

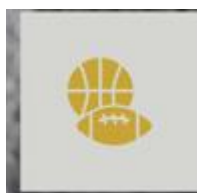

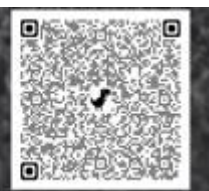
Inter house swimming gala

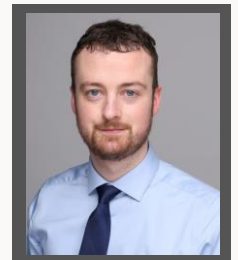

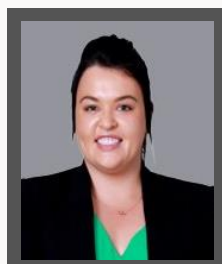
