

#### Drop-off and Collection of students

We are aware that the drop-off of and collection of students at school can sometimes be challenging. We want this process to be as organised as possible for parents, teaching staff and most importantly, students as it is important that they have a consistent routine at the start and end of the day. We understand that circumstances can change throughout the day, which may lead to last minutes changes to the end of day arrangements. Please communicate any late changes to end of day arrangements through reception as soon as possible as teaching staff are not always able to check their emails throughout the day.
