
## **AFTERNOON PICK UP - 2.20PM**

For the next 2 weeks, the below changes will be made to afternoon pick-up arrangements to try to ease the traffic. Once the ECA programme begins, we hope this will not be needed.

- **FS2 Pick Up** Parents collecting children from FS2 who **do not** have siblings higher up the school can enter through **Gate 1** from 2.00pm for a slightly earlier collection.
- **FS2 Year 6 Pick Up** The gates for all parents will now open at **2.10pm** if you arrive to school early for collection, please collect your children promptly and leave the school site to allow later families to drive through.
- **U-Turn through Gate 4** We are experiencing congestion build up by Gate 4 and 5 as parents are u-turning to exit the site. Once the school buses have safely left the parking area, Gate 4 will be opened, enabling parents to drive through and exit Gate 5. Please use this service once the gate is opened rather than u-turning on the road.

### **KEY POINTS**

- **Parking** Please park in the allocated parking spaces only, or in the sand car park. Parking along the roadside causes more congestion outside of the school.
- Traffic Marshalls Please listen to and respect the traffic marshalls that are on duty. We
  are all working together to make the drop off and pick up procedures as smooth as
  possible.

### **SCHOOL UNIFORM**

It has been lovely to welcome our new and returning students and I am so pleased to see them looking smart and ready to learn in their school uniforms. Please ensure that your children are meeting all aspects of the school uniform policy which has been shared. The key points to note are as follows:

- Completely black school shoes or trainers must be worn with school uniform.
- Students should only wear plain white, black or grey socks.
- Students with long hair should wear appropriate hair bands or clips.
- Only SVS branded long sleeve jumpers or jackets should be worn.
- Students are permitted to wear single studded earrings in each ear.
- School uniform shirts (not PE tops) should be tucked in.

### **END OF DAY ARRANGEMENTS**

Thank you to all families for their support during the first few days of term as Walk Home Alone (WHA) and Sibling Club arrangements have been put in place. The key points to note are as follows:

- WHA students should immediately leave school grounds via Gate 1 at the end of day.
- Older WHA students may collect their younger WHA siblings before leaving school grounds.
- WHA students must not go the Reception to await collection by family members.

#### STUDENT COMMUNICATION

As Primary School students become more independent and responsible, I understand that some students may be given phones or smart watches that will allow them to communicate with parents. The key points to not are as follows:

- All primary students must give their phones to their class teacher at the start of the day.
- Phone will be returned to students at the end of day.
- Students are not permitted to communicate online with friends or family members on any devices during the school day.
- All messages for children from parents should be sent to the class teacher through Seesaw.
