


English Update – Mr. Archibald

This Week:

Our emphasis was placed on enhancing listening and comprehension skills. Students participated in a range of structured activities designed to:

- A. Identify sounds, letters, and key vocabulary.
- B. Acquire new vocabulary and infer meanings through contextual understanding.
- C. Respond to questions that assess their grasp of both specific details and overall messages in spoken texts.
- D. Strengthen listening and concentration abilities to support better information retention.

We are also delighted to inform you that our students thoroughly enjoyed an educational visit to the *Museum of the Future*. This enriching experience offered them the opportunity to engage with innovative exhibits and deepen their learning in an inspiring environment beyond the classroom.

Looking Ahead – Next Week:

Our instructional focus will shift towards speaking and interactive communication skills. Students will be encouraged to:

- A. Apply acquired vocabulary and sentence structures in basic conversations.
- B. Express their thoughts clearly through activities such as dialogues, discussions, and interactive language games.
- C. Enhance their pronunciation and articulation through engaging phonetic exercises.
- D. Build confidence in speaking Arabic by engaging in real-life communication scenarios.

Please be reminded that the GCSE Arabic Speaking Examination is scheduled for Thursday, 1 May 2025. All relevant details have been communicated directly to the students. To support their preparation, we are currently offering morning reinforcement sessions aimed at building their confidence and readiness for this important assessment.

- Section 1: How Can I Support My Child with their learning/ revision in MFL?
- Routine Revision Encourage short daily sessions.
- **Stick to a schedule** Help your child plan time to revise each module across the coming weeks.
- Try the Pomodoro Technique Work in short, focused 25-minute sessions with 5-minute breaks. After 4 sessions, take a longer break. It helps with focus and reduces stress.
- Practise speaking Test your child using practice activities in their books. No Spanish? No problem! Ask him/her to translate for you.
- Active listening Let them listen to Spanish songs learnt in class, videos, or dialogues and summarise what they hear.
- Celebrate progress Keep motivation high by celebrating effort, not just results!
