

### **FS2 Swimming Lessons at SVS**

At SVS, our EYFS swimming program is designed to help students build confidence, develop essential water skills, and enjoy being active in the pool. **Through structured lessons, our FS2 students will:** 

- Enjoy being in the water while becoming more confident.
- Learn how to keep afloat, move in the water, and practice breathing techniques.
- Swim at least 10 metres using coordinated arm and leg movements.
- Explore different ways of moving in the water, take part in water activities and games, and become comfortable with submerging their heads.
- Develop early lifesaving skills and basic water rescue awareness. To ensure that every child is supported at their own pace, the class is divided into 3 groups based on ability and confidence. **Consistent participation is key** to steady progress, and we strongly encourage parents to provide proper swimming equipment suitable for the lessons.


