#### **Helping Your Child Build a Revision Programme**

As Assessment Week 1 approaches in November, it is important to create a clear and manageable revision plan with your child. This can make a huge difference to their confidence and success. Below are some practical tips to guide you in supporting them:

#### 1. Start with a timetable

Sit down together and map out the weeks leading up to assessments. Break each day into short 30–40 minute study sessions, with 10–15 minute breaks. Include time for relaxation, hobbies, and family—balance is key.

#### 2. Prioritise subjects

Focus first on areas your child finds most challenging. Rotate between subjects to keep revision fresh and engaging. Build in time for reviewing previously covered topics.

#### 3. Use active revision strategies

Encourage your child to:

Make flashcards or mind maps.

Practise past papers under timed conditions.

Teach you or a sibling a topic (explaining helps cement knowledge).

Use online tools, apps, or revision guides such as your child's Teams page for their subjects,

#### 4. Review progress together

At the end of each week, check what has been covered.

Adjust the timetable if needed—flexibility keeps motivation high.

Praise their effort and commitment.

#### 5. The night before assessments

Avoid cramming; encourage light review and relaxation.

Prepare equipment (pens, calculator, water bottle) in advance.

Aim for an early night—rest is as important as revision.

By helping your child plan and stick to a structured programme, you are giving them the tools and confidence they need to succeed.

One of the most effective ways to support your child's growth and development is through conversation.

Children and young people are constantly forming their understanding of the world around them, but their sense of fairness and justice can often be a little out of step. What might feel entirely justified to them in the moment can, when talked through calmly, look quite different in hindsight.

That's why positive questioning at home is so powerful. Rather than giving all the answers, ask the questions that help your child reflect. Why do you think that happened? How might the other person have felt? What could you do differently next time? These conversations not only encourage your child to consider multiple perspectives but also help them build empathy, resilience, and responsibility.

Taking time for these discussions at home gives children space to think, reflect, and grow. It helps them make better choices and understand the impact of their actions.

#### Clean, Tidy Spaces = Sharper Minds

We want to take a moment and share something important: the environment in which you learn and study has a real effect on how well you can focus, retain information, and perform.

- Untidy or cluttered spaces are distracting and can make it harder to concentrate.
- Students often find that when classrooms or study areas are dirty, it is harder to feel motivated or engaged in work.
- Clean, well-maintained learning spaces foster pride, calm, and a sense that "this is a place to work seriously."

#### What this means for our Sixth Form room

We've noticed that the Sixth Form room (and other shared spaces) sometimes become cluttered, untidy, or neglected. Over time, that degrades the atmosphere, makes it less pleasant to study there, and can distract everyone's focus.

Let's aim to change that together. Here are a few simple but powerful commitments we can all make:

- Always clear your area of rubbish, papers, wrappers, and bottles before leaving.
- Return books, stationery, chargers, and other shared items to their proper places.
- Wipe down surfaces if needed (dry cloths and cleaning spray will be provided).
- Be mindful of spills or messes and clean up immediately or alert staff.
- Respect shared facilities (microwave, fridge, sinks, bins) by leaving them clean and usable for the next person.
- Encourage one another: a friendly prompt is better than letting mess accumulate.

By building this habit, we can make the Sixth Form room (and all study areas) more comfortable, focused, and worthy of our efforts.

#### **Key Dates & What to Expect**

Clear communication around assessment dates helps students and families prepare with confidence. At South View School, we set aside specific assessment windows for each year group. These are carefully planned to avoid overload and to ensure students have time to revise properly in advance.

Our assessment week for Term 1 is commencing w/b Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> November. For Years 7-9 and Years 12-13, this will last one week. For Year 10 and 11, this will be spread over 2 weeks. All information for the forthcoming assessments will be sent out next week with revision topics and the finalised timetable.

We encourage students to prepare steadily, making use of revision guides, online resources, and teacher feedback. Small, regular revision is far more effective than last-minute cramming. By being organised and aware of key dates, students can reduce stress and approach assessments with confidence.

#### **SCIENCE UPDATE**

It's been a busy and exciting week in the Science Department, with pupils across year groups diving into hands-on activities and sharpening their scientific skills!

**Year 7** have been exploring the fascinating world of **acids and alkalis**. To bring their learning to life, pupils created their very own **red cabbage indicator** to test different household substances. This is a fun experiment you can even try at home, just ask our budding Year 7 scientists for a demonstration!

Meanwhile, our **Year 11 Triple Science students** have been grappling with the concept of **radioactive decay**. Using half-life cubes, they modelled the randomness of nuclear decay and investigated how half-life can be measured. This practical activity gave them a memorable way to understand an otherwise abstract concept.

Our **Year 8 chemists** took on the role of teachers this week, developing both their **scientific knowledge and presentation skills**. Working in groups, they taught each other about the different groups of the periodic table, an excellent way to deepen understanding while building confidence in public speaking.




#### **Arabic Phrase of the Week**


