- Create a comfortable reading space at home with good lighting.
- Discuss what your child is reading, ask questions, share opinions, and make connections to real life.
- Encourage reading for pleasure, not just for school assignments, to develop intrinsic motivation.

Our recent student surveys show that sleep is an area many students feel they can improve on. One helpful resource is the short video <u>How Your</u> <u>Child's Diet Affects Their Sleep</u>, where Dr. Blair Rolnick explains that "the foods children eat during the day can directly impact the quality and length of their sleep at night." Encouraging children to enjoy plenty of fruit and vegetables, limiting sugary or processed snacks in the evenings, and helping them switch off from screens before bed are all simple steps that can support healthier sleep patterns and, in turn, better learning.

At South View School, we are committed to understanding the full learning profile of every student. As part of this, students in Years 7-10 will complete the NGRT (New Group Reading Test) Form A in English lessons next week, and all students in Years 7-13 will sit the PASS (Pupil Attitudes to Self and School) test in extended form on Friday 26<sup>th</sup> October. For these assessments, can we please ask that all students have their laptop, charger and headphones.

#### **NGRT (New Group Reading Test):**

The NGRT is designed to assess reading comprehension and vocabulary knowledge. It provides valuable insights into students' literacy skills, which are essential across all subjects. The results allow us to identify strengths and pinpoint areas where additional support may be needed. By understanding each student's reading ability, teachers can adapt teaching methods and ensure that all learners can access the curriculum effectively.

#### PASS (Pupil Attitudes to Self and School):

The PASS test measures students' attitudes towards themselves as learners and their feelings about school. It helps us to better understand motivation, confidence, and possible barriers to learning, including wellbeing concerns. This information is invaluable in supporting not only academic progress but also student welfare.

Together, NGRT and PASS provide a more complete picture of each student, combining academic ability with attitudes and perceptions. This helps us tailor teaching, intervention, and pastoral support, ensuring that every child has the best opportunity to thrive.



#### SCIENCE UPDATE

This week has been a busy and exciting one in the Science Department, with pupils continuing to explore a wide range of topics through engaging, hands-on lessons, with examples such as:

**Year 8** pupils have been learning about digestion, following the journey of food step by step as it travels through the digestive system. Practical activities helped them visualise and understand this process in action.

**Year 9** pupils have been investigating *speed*, using cars and marbles rolling down ramps to calculate speed. They also attended an assembly on their *Science iGCSE options*. If you have any questions about this, please contact **Mr Mutton**.

In **year 10 Biology**, pupils had the opportunity to dissect cows' eyes, gaining valuable insight into anatomy and structure.


In **Chemistry**, our **A level students** have been working on core practical, such as measing gas volumes and rates of chemical reactions.

# Psychology and Sociology Display Boards Supporting Students Learning

#### In the Classroom:

Display boards provide students with a quick reference to key exam content, helping them recall important topics, structures of papers, and assessment requirements without needing to constantly check their notes. Visual prompts, such as paper breakdowns, key theories, and topic summaries, support memory retention by reinforcing learning through repeated exposure. They act as support during lessons, allowing students to independently check information and focus more effectively on applying their knowledge in class discussions and practice questions.

### **Beyond the Classroom:**

By clearly showing how topics are assessed, display boards help students develop stronger exam technique and revision strategies. They encourage independent learning, as students can use the boards to identify areas they need to review in greater detail at home. Display boards make subject content more accessible and less overwhelming by presenting it in an organised, student-friendly way. Over time, repeated use builds confidence, supports long-term memory, and fosters good learning habits that are valuable both in class and in independent study.
