As we begin an exciting new academic year, I am delighted to be writing to you in my new role as Assistant Head of Secondary for Data and Assessment. Our philosophy of assessment moving forward is clear: we will not assess simply for the sake of it. Instead, assessment will be purposeful, informative, and designed to provide meaningful feedback that helps students understand their next steps and enables teachers to tailor their teaching more effectively.

In the coming weeks, our **Year 7 students** will complete their **CAT4 baseline tests** on **Friday 12th September**. This is the only year group that will undergo CAT4 testing this year, as it provides us with valuable insight into each student's verbal, quantitative, non-verbal, and spatial reasoning abilities. The results give teachers an additional tool to support learning, plan interventions, and ensure that every child is both challenged and supported appropriately.

To ensure smooth running of the tests, all Year 7 students will need to bring their **laptop**, **charger**, **and headphones** on the day.

I am very much looking forward to the year ahead and to seeing how we can use assessment not only to measure attainment, but to genuinely enhance learning for all.

### **ENGLISH UPDATE**

- A Level English: Our A Level students have made an excellent start, engaging enthusiastically with their set texts and beginning to develop the independent study habits that are so vital for success.

#### MATHS UPDATE

Welcome back! The Maths department is off to a positive start as we embark on a new academic year, all focused on developing students' progress and achievement in mathematics. We are thrilled to be back and excited for the journey ahead.

A special welcome back to our returning staff members, Ms. Hughes and Mr. Gaby. We are also incredibly excited to introduce the newest members of our team: Mr. Moodliar, Ms. Houston, and Mr. Afkhami. Their unique skills and passion will undoubtedly be a huge asset to the department, and we are delighted to have them on board.



Our Year 7 students have begun their high school careers with an engaging Inquiry task designed to sharpen their problem-solving skills. Following this, they've sat their baseline test, which will help us understand their current strengths. Next week, they will be placed into their permanent maths groups, ready to begin the core curriculum with Basic Number Skills. This approach will ensure a smooth and effective start to their high school education.

Meanwhile, our students in Years 8 through 13 have jumped straight into their schemes of learning with impressive determination. The Maths team has been impressed by the excellent attitude, enthusiasm, and effort from day one. It is this level of commitment that we believe will foster a genuine love of learning and lead to excellent progress for all students throughout the year.

Finally, a truly humongous congratulations to all the students who received their GCSE and A-Level results this summer. We were absolutely delighted to see the very good results you achieved in Maths. Your hard work and perseverance paid off, and we are incredibly proud of everything you accomplished.

#### Year 9 and Year 10 – Modular IGCSE for Mathematics

Last year Pearson Edexcel introduced a modular specification for the Maths IGCSE. Year 9 and 10 will now follow this specification. We've already begun working on **Module 1** with both year groups and have explained the key benefits of this approach:

- Clearer Structure: We know exactly what topics will be in each module.
- Reduced Exam Load: Students can sit exams before Year 11, potentially reducing their final exam stress.
- Retake Opportunities: Students will have the chance to resit modules to improve their grades.

The plan for each year group is as follows:

**Year 10:** The aim is to complete Module 1 and take the GCSE exam at the end of Year 10. They will then complete Module 2 and sit that exam at the end of Year 11.

**Year 9:** They will complete Module 1 and take the exam in November of Year 10. Module 2 will be completed in Year 11. The most able students in this year group may also have the opportunity to study for a **Further Maths** gualification.

Dear Students, Parents, and Guardians,


